Introducing VETFest

The VETFest Project aims to improve the quality and attractiveness of VET provision, by strengthening the cooperation among VET providers through mutual learning, peer counselling and capacity building.



The Project

VETFest – 12 Events for Transnational and National VET networks is a two year Project, running from October 2019 to September 2021, co-funded by the Erasmus+ Programme of the European Commission.

It is implemented by a consortium of eleven (11) partners from five (5) countries: Portugal, Spain, Italy, Greece, and Turkey.

The VETFest Project foresees to provide solutions to the challenges faced by VET. It brings together partners with profiles as diverse as local VET networks, networked and not-networked VET providers with different profiles, a national association of start-ups and an institution focused on networking enterprises.

The VET sector faces various challenges in its course to progression: limited teamwork and exchange of good practices between VET institutions, low social recognition of VET graduation when compared with the regular school learning paths, lack of internationalization of VET institutions, trainers and trainees, difficulties of the VET institutions in implementing quality monitoring mechanisms like EQAVET, outdated knowledge of VET trainers, etc.



The Objectives

The Project aims to achieve four main objectives:

- Creation of a transnational network of VET providers.
- Fostering cross-border cooperation through the exchange and implementation of good practices.
- Improvement of the quality of VET through peer counselling for the implementation of EU instruments, namely EQAVET.
- Assistance in internalization actions of VET institutions and the professional development of their teachers.

The Main Outputs

The Project will produce the following main results:

- Good Practices on VET Booklet: it will include good practices regarding events, internationalization practices, EQAVET and professional development of VET teachers/trainers.
- 12VETFest Plan: it will include the 12 good practices that the partners selected as the most relevant to be implemented in partner countries.
- 12VETFest Roadmap: it will contain the guidelines for the implementation of each good practice, including the description, the physical and human resources, the tools and steps to operate; the target-group; the impact and the evaluation.
- A Cooperation Protocol: it will formally establish a transnational network of VET for the exchange of good practices and peercounseling.
